WHO WAS JOHN KEATS?

- John Keats was a young English poet who successfully marked history by creating his own poetic rhyme schemes and changing the way sonnets had been written by great writers like William Shakespeare and Francesco Petrarch. However, in his time he was not known as much until after his death at age 25 due to a venereal disease (tuberculosis).
- Among John Keats works we find beautifully thought letters to his loved ones and poems.

SKETCH BY CHARLES BROWN

- Charcoal sketch of John Ketas
- Charles Brown did it in 1819
- Published the sketch until the 20th century.
- Sketch is found in the National Portrait Gallery in London.
- According to Wolfson's book, "Brown's sketch of Keats in 1819 renders a handsome 'young poet,' big-fisted, contemplative, self-possessed, the pose conscious of Richard Westall's famous profile of Lord Byron (1813, after the overnight success of Childe Harold's Pilgrimage).

- Found in book of John Keats in Princeton University's Library



KEATS SKETCH IN HIS DEATH BED

- Joseph Severn Sketched it.
- Keats was located in the Keats-Shelley House, in Rome.
- In Page 141 we find what Severn wrote under his sketch of John Keats, "28 January, 1821, 3 o' clock in the morning, drawn to keep me awake. A deadly sweat was on him all this night."














LIFE AND DEATH MASKS

- The sketch of the grave of Keats was by Joseph Sabin
- Etching
- 1821-1881
- Sketch is found in Princeton University
- The gravesite is located at the Protestant cementery in Rome
